Value

Our value this term is Respect. We will explore how we can show respect, to ourselves and others; the importance of respecting and valuing difference; the Golden Rule from the United Nations; people whom we respect and why; respecting and valuing places and respecting and valuing different opinions.

STEER

This term we are introducing a wellbeing assessment and tracking tool called STEER Tracking for our children in year 3-6. The tool was initially used for children in their adolescent years but it has been adapted by the STEER organisation for children of KS2.

It's not always easy for us to know which students need our help as they don't or can't always tell us, even though we ask. Some students need a little extra help to make the right choice at the right time; they can get a bit stuck. This can have an impact on their academic progress, friendships, wellbeing, and mental health. Knowing who these students are, early enough, means we can give targeted signposts to help them steer their choices better.

Sometimes we only know something is wrong when we see a change in their behaviour or a dip in their learning; we think that's too late. We want to know which students need our help, as early as possible, even if their needs are hidden or masked, and what we can do to help. STEER Tracking will

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enable us to give the right student, the right support, at the right time and it also will indicate those students who are currently successfully navigating the choices they make in the following areas.

Self Disclosure:I can choose when to share my thoughts and feelings, or keep them privateTrust of Self:I can choose to trust or question what I think or doTrust of Others:I can choose to trust or question what others think or doSeeking Change:I can choose to change things or keep them as they are

We will be asking all children in yr3 - 6 to complete the short, simple and safe STEER online assessment up to three times each academic year. The assessment tracks how each student is *steering* or making choices in four areas important for healthy adolescent development...

If we identify an area where your child may need support, your child's teacher will share insights with you so we can work together to proactively guide and signpost your child when they need it.
