Parents Evening

Year 3 - Parent meetings will be held differently for this class. They will be held during the afternoon of Wednesday 28th February, on Teams. To enable this to happen the children will need to split for the afternoon, taking their learning to complete to other classes in the school. The appointment slots will be 10 minutes and each meeting will end automatically at the end of the allocated time. When you receive the parents' evening letter, please indicate which time slot would suit you best and we will do our best to accommodate this. Once you have been allocated a time slot you will be sent a Team's link via your email address.

Parent Academy Council Member (Governor) Vacancy

Would you like to be more involved in your child's education?

If you would, why not consider becoming an Academy Council member? There is currently a vacancy for a Parent Academy Council member at this school.

The Academy Council, with the Head and Board of Directors of the Trust, has overall responsibility for the running of the school. Their responsibilities include:

- Ensuring clarity of vision, ethos and strategic direction
- Holding the Head to account for the educational performance of the school and its pupils
- Advising on school policies and procedures
- Helping recruit staff
- Overseeing the financial performance of the school and making sure its money is well spent

If you are interested in becoming a Parent Academy Council member but feel a little daunted by the responsibility you may be taking on, remember that full training will be available, and you will always act as part of a team. No special qualifications are needed, and the most important thing is to have a keen interest in the school and be prepared to play an active part in the Academy Council's work. Academy Council members also need the ability to be able to build relationships with a range of people, to be able to work as part of a team, to be able to question, and to make connections between different types of information.

If you become an Academy Council member you will be taking on the following commitments to help make sure the school is well managed:

- Share the responsibilities of the Academy Council as summarised above.
- Attend and participate in meetings on a regular basis
- Undergo appropriate training
- You may also be invited to sit on appointment panels or attend committee meetings

You will be required to sign the Code of Practice, and to apply for a DBS enhanced disclosure. Please also refer to the attached 'Qualifications and Disqualifications to serve as an Academy Council member'.

If you would like to stand for election, please complete the enclosed nomination form and return it to the school. You should also include a short personal statement to support your nomination, which should be no longer than 100 words.

The closing date for nominations is 12 noon on Friday 23rd February.

If there are more nominations than vacancies the election will be by secret ballot. If that is necessary, voting papers will be sent to all parents together with details of the ballot procedure.
